

During the workshop Ornithologist from Lucknow Dr. Rajesh Prakash Chaube delivered a lecture on *"Diversity of Water birds"*. In his presentation, he focused on importance of wetlands in survival of water birds.

2- World Sparrow and Butterfly Week 2020 (March14-20, 2020)

The diminutive house sparrow (Passer domesticus) is perhaps one of the earliest birds you can remember from your childhood. Their nests dotted almost every house in the neighborhood as well as public places like bus bays and railway stations, where they lived in colonies and survived on food grains and tiny worms. Many bird watchers and ornithologists recall with fondness how the house sparrow gave flight to their passion for observing birds. The association between humans and the house sparrow




dates back to several centuries and no other bird has been associated with humans on a daily basis like the house sparrow. It is a bird that evokes fond memories and has thus found mention in folklore and songs from time immemorial.

World Sparrow Day provides a platform where people who are working on the conservation of the House Sparrow and other common birds can network, collaborate and exchange conservation ideas which will lead to better science and improved results.

It aims to provide a meeting ground for people from different parts of the world to come together and form a force that can play an important role in advocacy and in spreading the awareness on the need of conserving common biodiversity or species of lower conservation status



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












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


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






Sparrow Count on 20th March 2020

20 मार्च को हर साल गौरैया संरक्षण दिवस मनाया जाता है। लखनऊ विवि के प्राणि विज्ञान विभाग की प्रोफेसर डॉ अमिता कनौजिया ने बताया कि छह सालों में गौरैया की संख्या चार गुना बढ गई है।

2013 में केवल 2503 पक्षियों की संख्या दर्ज की गई थी। साल दर साल हमने संख्या में सकारात्मक बढ़ोत्तरी दर्ज की। यूपी में गौरैया की तीन प्रजातियां पाई जाती हैं जिनमें पासेर डोमेस्टिकस, इंडिकस पासेर, डोमेस्टिकस बैक्ट्रीएनस, पासेर डोमेस्टिकस पार्किनी शामिल हैं। स्टेट ऑफइंडिया बर्ड्स 2020 रिपोर्ट में कहा गया है कि गौरैया की स्थिति लगभग स्थिर है।
